
Book Club Adventure - Part 4 -

When you summarize a text, you do a retell of the most important events that took place in the reading. Look at the poster for a better idea! Don't worry, I'll meet you at the top of the next page!



Summary

A summary is a shortened version of the story. It retells all the important parts of the story.

A Summary:

- is told in sequence
- can include the main idea, supporting details, and theme of the story
- can be written in 3-5 sentences

To help write a summary think:

Beginning	-Who are the characters? -What is the setting? -What is the problem?
Middle	-What events happen to the characters? -What is the climax of the story?
End	-How is the problem resolved? -How have the characters changed?

So, we've learned that a summary needs to have details from the beginning, middle, and end of our reading. It's also short, about 3-5 sentences in length. We will read our fourth and last section of our books now. When you're done reading, complete the work below. There is also a bonus, final activity for you afterwards!


